

## **ABOUT THE WPIAL**

The Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League (WPIAL) was founded in 1906 by a small assembly of educators who recognized the necessity of establishing a set of eligibility rules and regulations that would insure an equal playing field for the interscholastic athletic competition among the schools in Western Pennsylvania. The first motivation for this League arose in 1903 when the lack of scholastic requirements allowed the schools to hire the best players in the area, dress them in their high school's colors and represent the school on the playing field. Representatives of Allegheny Prep, Pittsburgh, Central High School, and Shady Side Academy began the effort in its initial stages. It was not until 1906 when E. W. Rynearson of Pittsburgh Fifth Avenue, Headmaster Jones of Allegheny Prep, and W. R. Crabbe of Shady Side Academy joined forces to create the first set of eligibility rules. Due to much uncertainty and negativity the work of the League was not finished until 1914.

Leading up to 1914, there was progressive growth of the League was expanded to many towns in the Pittsburgh area. The growth was controlled so that the League could accommodate small numbers on an annual basis. The old Allegheny Valley League was the only one absorbed as an organization, while all the schools who applied for membership were admitted as volunteer members. The successful efforts of creating the WPIAL were transferred to the formation of the state association known as the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) in 1914.

The original WPIAL Constitution of 1906 was revised in 1919, 1924, 1946, 1949, 1958 and 1966 with the growth of member institutions and their desired activities. Eventually the WPIAL document was retired and the League adopted the PIAA Constitution in 1973. In 1982 the WPIAL, which originally was designated as District VII in 1914, officially became the WPIAL/District VII.

The growth and success of the largest high school athletic league in the United States can be attributed to the wisdom of its founding fathers. The leadership established by the Decision Committee, as the first governing body of the League was known, provided the substance for the growth of the league from its initial group of three high schools to 156 as late as the 1981-1982 school year. Currently there are 137 high schools who are proud members of the WPIAL. As the League grew in size and opportunity the original Decision Committee of three high school principals was expanded, reaching a capacity of ten individuals in 1964. The determination of all the men and women who voluntarily served the WPIAL as a member of the Decision Committee/Board of Control (Later name beginning in 1976) contributed greatly to the recognition and success of an idea that changed the entire perspective of high school sports, which is very evident in today's interscholastic programs.

## ABOUT THE PIAA

The Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) provides the opportunity and privilege to member schools' boys and girls to represent their school and community through participation in interscholastic athletics. Regardless of the athlete's level of participation in interscholastic athletics, being involved builds character traits and interpersonal skills that are difficult to duplicate in other settings.

The PIAA was formed on December 29, 1913, in Pittsburgh by a group of high school Principals who wanted to eliminate abuses, establish uniform rules, and place interscholastic athletics in the overall context of secondary education. The purposes of PIAA, as set forth in Article II of its Constitution, are to:

- Develop, direct, and organize an interscholastic athletic program which will promote, protect, and preserve the health and physical welfare of all participants.
- Formulate and maintain policies that will safeguard the educational values of interscholastic athletics and promote the main principles of good sportsmanship.
- Promote uniformity of standards in all interscholastic athletic competition.

The PIAA was given the privilege of serving its member schools and registered officials by creating policies and adopting contest rules that:

- 1. Emphasize the educational values of interscholastic athletics,
- 2. Promote competition that is safe and sportsmanlike and
- 3. Provide uniform standards for all levels of interscholastic competition.

As a result of the cooperation of its membership, the PIAA has assisted students ranging from middle school to senior high school with their participation in interscholastic athletic programs on a fair and unbiased basis, while creating important education benefits. The PIAA believes that a system that best serves the student-athlete is one that emphasizes the amateur, educational, and character-building aspects of high school sports while also recognizing that athletics is not the driving force.

The membership of PIAA consists of 1,422 schools, of which 764 are senior high schools. More than 350,000 students participate in interscholastic athletics at all levels (varsity, junior varsity, or otherwise) of competition under PIAA authority. For administrative purposes the PIAA is divided into twelve geographic districts, each of which has a District Committee elected by the member schools within that state district. Each District Committee elects a chairman, who becomes the district's representative on the Board of Directors, the statewide governing body of the organization. Nearly all Board of Director members of the District Committees are experienced professional educators with background and experience in dealing with high school athletics. The PIAA is governed by a Constitution that has been adopted by its member schools and the By-Laws adopted by its elected Board of Directors.

The four major areas in which PIAA currently operates are:

- 1. Establishing and enforcing rules that govern the eligibility of high school athletes' participation in interscholastic athletics (rules for academic performance and attendance, age, amateur status, and transfers).
- 2. Adopting the contest rules for each sport under its jurisdiction. With the exception of bowling, golf, rifle, and tennis.
- 3. Registering and providing training opportunities for officials to officiate at contests in which PIAA member schools participate.
- 4. Organizing and operating Inter-District Championship contests in the sports of baseball, basketball, competitive spirit, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, volleyball, and wrestling.

### Dynamic Duo Looks to steer the Vikings back to Heinz Field

Central Catholic is primed for a third consecutive trip to Heinz Field thanks to seniors Damar Hamlin and Bricen Garner. The dynamic duo returns after combing for eight interceptions and four defensive scores to lead the Vikings secondary in 2015. They headline a defense that also features D-I recruits Rashad Wheeler, Ron George, and David Adams in the front seven. The Viking secondary should be able to flex their muscles even more this season thanks to a strong returning cast of members of the "Chain Gang" and with the departure of seven of the Northern Eight's starting quarterbacks from a year ago.

Pine Richland was responsible for Central Catholic's two losses in route to winning their first WPIAL Quad-A championship. The Vikings are looking for revenge as they aim to take back their place atop the Northern Eight. Pine Richland looks to rebuild a record-setting offense that lost Ben DiNucci, Mike Merhaut, and four of its other top playmakers to graduation. Central Catholic is the only team in the conference to return their quarterback from 2014, with Michael Navarro back to direct the offense. North Allegheny appears to be the Vikings' biggest challenger with a lot of talent returning for 2015. North Hills and Butler both feature young teams that could each factor into the shape atop the conference, while Seneca Valley could surprise if a young team and a new system can click early enough in the season.

The main key to Central Catholic's success will be the stellar secondary duo of Damar Hamlin and Bricen Garner, who stand as two of Central Catholic's five Division I recruits. Garner has already made his verbal commitment to the University of Pittsburgh, while Hamlin is the ninth-ranked safety in the country and has received over 30 Division I offers. If Central Catholic is to win the Northern Eight they will have to win on the road against North Allegheny and Pine Richland.

### Flashback:

The first year under Rob Densmore was more about establishing a winning culture, than the two-win season on the field. The Golden Tornado played a lot of underclassman and took their lumps as a result. Losing seven games is never a good thing, but if you look in between the lines the effort and mental toughness of the Golden Tornado was clearly improved from the previous season.

### **OFFENSE**

The biggest question for the Golden Tornado heading into 2015 is at the quarterback position. Jamison Smith was the starter for most of 2014 but graduated in the spring. Senior Shad Stepp and Juniors Alec Bayer and Dallas Hays all saw time at quarterback and will compete for the job; Bayer played the most in 2014 of the three. In addition to Smith, Lucas Dubyak (441 rush yds & 3 TD) and Rob Kunst (134 rec yds & TD) also graduated in June, leaving some holes in the offensive production. Butler returns both its leading rusher and receiver from with. Damien Pickett and Kelley Kuharic lcoming back for a senior campaign. Butler is also faced with the task of replenishing their offensive line, which will ultimately determine the pace of the offense in 2015. A stronger offensive line and an established running game should give the new quarterback an easier transition.

### **DEFENSE**

The Tornado defense was the strong area of the team in 2014 and looks to improve in year two of Rob Densmore's system. The expectation comes with the return of seniors Tim Vernick and Rhett Wahler, who look to be the leaders in the 4-4 defensive alignment that will have seniors with varsity experience. A trio of juniors that are expected to play a role are Alec Bayer, Dallas Hays, and Noah Ryder. Hays and Bayer are expected to join Kelley Kuharic in the secondary, while Ryder will round out the four linebackers. The Tornado feature much experience up front with a solid core of seniors set to start. It is safe to say that if Butler is to compete with the top of the conference, the defense will have to be even fiercer in 2015.

### **OFFENSE**

If the Titans are to finally snap this losing streak the defense will need to hold opponents to at south of 30 points while being able to create pressure and turnovers this season.

### FINAL ANALYSIS

For a program that has not won a game since October of 2011, just one victory would be a step in the right direction. Jon LeDonne appears to bring the right attitude and leadership that will get Shaler past this streak and back to respectability. ### Woody High looks at Big Three to finally taste Quad-A Gold Again

Woodland Hills has been to the Quad-A championship game five times in the past decade, the most of any Quad-A school, but only have one WPIAL title (2009) to show for it. The Wolverines head into 2015 believing this could be the year that they finally get to celebrate again on Heinz Field in late November. A big part of the reason to believe comes from three seniors who helped Woody High reach the title game in 2012 and 2013. The most coveted member of the "Big Three" is running back Miles Sanders who is ranked as the number one college recruit in Pennsylvania. The other two-thirds of the group are also highly talented, as running back Jo-El Shaw and Jeremiah Jones are set to also guide the Wolverines deep into the playoffs.

The Big Three returns after tearing opponents apart in 2014. The talented trio combined to gain over 2,200 yards and 34 touchdowns while Jeremiah Jones added 842 yards and seven touchdowns through the air. Woodland Hills is not the only team in the Southeastern conference that returns top talent. Penn Hills appears to be the biggest road block to Woodland Hills' title hopes with the return of their dual-threat quarterback Billy Kisner, along with Frederick Squires and Malik Mathis. Upper St. Clair will also factor into the conference race thanks to the return of both their leading receiver (Doug Wagner) and rusher (Thomas Vissman) from a year ago, in addition to welcoming Division-I recruit Brandon Ford back to the offensive line. Mt. Lebanon looks to be a dark-horse in the Southeastern race thanks to an experienced senior class that is led by quarterback Eddie Jenkins. Bethel Park will also look to be in the mix since they welcome back senior quarterback Levi Metheny and junior running back Terron Murphy to lead their offense.

On paper Woodland Hills looks to be the leader of the pack, but with all the experience returning across the conference the race for the Southeastern title looks to be a season-long battle that is sure to provide many thrilling contests in 2015.

### Flashback:

The Big Macs failed to win a game in 2014 and were outscored by an average of 34-8. A lot of sophomores and juniors saw key time and should be able to bring that experience with them into Mike Evans' first year in Canonsburg. A prime example of the youth in the program was sophomore Bryan Milligan, who led the team with 442 rushing yards and 3 touchdowns.

### **OFFENSE**

The Big Macs have a lot to be optimistic about on offense heading into the 2015 campaign. The first year in Mike Evans' system will feature many faces that saw time at the varsity level last season. The four guys to focus on are quarterback Dom Eannace, running backs Bryan Milligan and Brennan Handyside, and receiver Jordan Smith. These four men compiled over 80% of the offensive yards last season and will have to do the same if Canon-Mac is to make any noise. The offensive line has a strong variance in experience but still features good size that should mix nicely with a run game that features two talented backs. If Dom Eannace can complete a higher percentage of his passes then this Big Mac offense could just be good enough to pose a challenge for some of the big boys in the Southeastern.

### **DEFENSE**

The defense has nowhere to go but up from a unit that surrendered 34.2 points per game last season. A steady mix of upperclassman provides some intrigue along the front seven. The one player that stands out is senior linebacker Shane Danyo, who earned all-conference honors for his efforts in 2014. Two other names to watch up front are seniors Edward Cottrill and Ahmad Morris-Walker, who will be tasked with trying to stop some of the hottest D-I recruits in the WPIAL. That won't be the only big Southeastern game at home, as Woody High will also welcome Upper St. Clair and Mt. Lebanon to the Wolvarena later in the season. The toughest game of the regular season for Novak's bunch will be a road trip to rival Penn Hills on Halloween weekend which could very well decide the conference title.

#### Laffoon, Vecchio look to keep Penn-Trafford atop the Foothills

The 2014 season was as memorable as can be without a November trip to Heinz Field for Penn-Trafford. Completing an undefeated regular season, reclaiming the Foothills Conference championship, beating North Allegheny in the WPIAL quarterfinals, and reaching the semifinals are just about as good of a season that a program can have without winning it all. Two of the major components to the Warriors' 2014 success were quarterback Brett Laffoon and wide receiver Tim Vecchio, who are both set to return for their senior season in 2015. Laffoon enters his third season as the starter and is coming off a year were he finished as the second-best passer in all of Quad-A by throwing for over 2,000 yards and 26 touchdown passes. Tim Vecchio looks to lead the Warriors in receiving for a third straight year, especially after a season in which he was one of three receivers in Quad-A to surpass the 1,000-yard mark while catching at least 15 touchdowns.

If anybody is going to beat Penn-Trafford this season it is going to have to be with defense, which points to McKeesport as being the top challenger. The Tigers return many of the players and key contributors that took part in a semifinal run of their own in 2014. Headlining an experienced group of talent is the WPIAL's second-highest rated recruit Khaleke Hudson who, to put it simply, dominates on both sides of the ball. He is joined by Tymar Sutton, Jahsai Allen, Kyreek Sayles, and Davon Brown to lead the Tiger defense. Plum and Norwin each return a nice collection of players from last season's playoff runs and appear certain to also factor into the action at the top of the conference.

The road to repeating as Foothills champs will definitely be no cake walk for the Warriors but with the prolific duo of Laffoon and Vecchio headlining a team that is talented and experienced on both sides of the ball certainly points to Penn-Trafford being the favorite in 2015.




